

One grandson died when he was 23 after serving in the military. One great grandchild died when he was but 70 days old.

"Two granddaughters live in upper

New York with my oldest daughter. Four live in the Sacramento area. Five of my great grandchildren live in Southern Calif., near my second oldest daughter. One grandson and two of my great grandchildren



live in Rio Linda with my oldest granddaughter.

"I was named after my grandmother on my dad's side but my mom didn't want me to be named after a horse so my mother drop the 'e' and added the 'a'".

"As for my first job, I went to school and worked in my folk's restaurant when my mother was sick. After graduating I went into the business.

"I have worked in all parts of the business from waitress, cook, manger and owner.

"I have been a cook/manager for Zim's in San Fran-

cisco; Area Manager for Zim's: Clerk for a car company; Drill inspector for Shell *Oil: and owner of* own restaurant for 20 years in Sacramento."



Mauda was hired as House Director about ten years ago,

by Gary Christensen.

"Here is what I like best about this position. I can help people find a place to gather their wits in a stressful time. I enjoy the people that I meet, the members from clubs that volunteer here, and best of all the children that we help. I also suffer the pain for those that don't make it."

"There are stories that have touched my heart and I will never forget. Such as little Brittany(9 years old) with cancer, to watch her fade away, to see a smile on her face was worth more than anyone can know, When she passed it was painful but knowing she wouldn't be in any more pain, then just recently we found out her Father was killed in a car accident.

"The young man from Iceland that lost both legs and one hand, how he showed us all the strength that we have with our families and having a positive attitude makes it all worthwhile.

"The families that had babies born here December 2009 (there were three born on December 15th). One was almost a year old and after many stays and surgery he passed on."



Wake up! Its Awake-A-Thon time

There are many ways to financially support our Kiwanis Family House. Each issue of *House Talk* offers suggestions as to ways to accomplish this.




In addition, Sponsor Clubs have the requirement to have an annual fund raiser.

The Awake-A-Thon project is being offered as a FUN fund raising event. It is carried out by a Key Club or two.

It is a one night event, which provides a fun outing for the Key Clubbers and financial support for our KFH. It could produce more in one night greater than an entire crab feed, more that a half dozen nights at the King's game.

Each KFH Ambassador has a "How to" manual. It offers forms and requirements to pull it off.

It takes careful planning.



The prime mover of the Awake-A-Thon project is educator **Robert Tabares**.

Here is an inside story of how it began.

Where did you get the idea? I got the idea from a news report of students staying awake all night to raise funds for their fundraiser.

Ten years ago we started the Awake-A-

Thon because the Key Clubbers at Florin High School wanted to help the Make-A-Wish Foundation.

After the first two Awake-A-Thons, our Vice Principal Mr. **Mark Macres** told me about another needy group: the Children's Gaucher Research Fund. He knew of this group, because his nephew died from the



Gaucher disease at the age of four. **Mark Macres'** brother **Greg Macres** (who spoke at the Awake-A-Thon) started gathering funds to support research to find a cure for the Gaucher disease. * So I suggested that our Key Clubbers at Florin High take on the Awake-A-Thon that would allow kids to help kids.



After completing five Awake-A-Thons at Florin High School, I also added the Awake-A-Thon to Pleasant Grove High School for the past five years. About four years ago **Gary Christensen** from the Kiwanis House suggested that one Awake-A-Thon would be for Kiwanis Family House and the other for the Children's Gaucher Research Fund.



*Gaucher disease is a rare genetic disorder in which a person lacks an enzyme called glucocerebrosidase.

The lack of the glucocerebrosidase enzyme causes harmful substances to build up in the liver, spleen, bones, and bone marrow. The substances prevent cells and organs from working properly. Florin High School has kept the Awake-A-Thon going for the past ten years.

Why do you do it? I organize the Awake-A-Thons because it allows students to help two important worthwhile groups: The Kiwanis Family House and the Children's Gaucher Research Fund. By completing the Awake-A-Thons it shows that teenagers can do positive acts in this world while we hear negatives acts by other teenagers.

How much money do you think was raised over the 10 or so events? Florin High holds their Awake-A-Thons each November: The first Awake-A-Thon raised was \$3,600 and the most was \$18,500. Our Pleasant Grove High School Key Clubbers hold our Awake-A-Thons each March: Pleasant Grove has raised from \$8,600-\$12,700 each year.

As an educator, do you get feedback from the students after the event? What do they say? The students like staying up with their high school friends, but they also get to know other Key Clubbers from other Key Clubs. The students also get 12 hours of community service, but they really like raising money for two worthy groups.

Anything else? These events would not be able to succeed without the volunteers: Key Clubbers, Kiwanians from East Sacramento and Rancho Murieta and the staff at Pleasant Grove. We average about 400 Key Clubbers at each Awake-A-Thon.

Looking elsewhere: Gary Christensen reports: "Florin High had one in November that resulted in a \$1,000 donation to the KFH and Burbank High did one in January that resulted in \$2,300 to the KFH."

U.S. News & World Report has ranked UC Davis School of Medicine among America's best medical schools. The weekly news magazine's annual listing appeared today on the publication's website and will be published in its guidebook, America's Best Graduate Schools 2012.

U.S. News & World Report assessed medical schools across the country for both the quality of their research training and primary-care training. This year's rankings place UC Davis School of Medicine at 42nd for research and 41st for primary care.

The 126 medical schools fully accredited by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education, plus the 20 schools of osteopathic medicine fully accredited by the American Osteopathic Association, were surveyed for the ranking of research medical schools; 123 schools provided the data needed to calculate the research rankings based on the indicators used in the research model.

The same medical and osteopathic schools were surveyed for the primarycare ranking; 123 schools provided the data needed to calculate the primarycare ranking.

Both rankings are based on a weighted average of indicators, four of them common to both models. The research model accounts for research activity; the primary-care model adds a measure of the proportion of graduates entering primary-care specialties. The rankings were based on measures of quality as determined by:

- A peer assessment score derived from ratings by medical and osteopathic school deans;
- Deans of academic affairs, and heads of internal medicine or the directors of admissions;
- An assessment score by residency program directors;
- Total dollar amount of National Institutes of Health research grants;
- Average research activity per clinical faculty;
- Primary-care rate -- the percentage of medical or osteopathic school graduates entering primarycare residencies in the fields of family practice, pediatrics and internal medicine averaged over the 2008, 2009 and 2010 graduating classes;

- Student selectivity, as measured by mean Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) score, mean undergraduate grade point average (GPA) and acceptance rate;
- Faculty resources;
- Overall rank; and
- Specialty rankings based solely on ratings by medical school deans and senior faculty from the list of schools surveyed. They each identified up to 10 schools offering the best programs in each specialty area.

The UC Davis School of Medicine is among five medical schools in the University of California system, including the schools in San Diego, Irvine, Los Angeles and San Francisco.

The UC Davis School of Medicine is among the nation's leading medical schools, recognized for its research and primary-care programs.


